### SUBJECT: Itemized Estimate of COVID Expenses for FY 22 Budget

As requested, the administration reached out to our local health officials, Connecticut Association of Public School Superintendents, Connecticut State Department of Education, and the Connecticut Department of Public Health seeking advice on whether or not to anticipate COVID restrictions being in place for next school year. Their collective recommendations, based on best assumptions at this time, is that schools will be in session with physical distancing and mitigation strategies for the fall, and it would be reasonable to estimate such expenses for the first 45 school days. Attached is an itemized estimate of the COVID related expenses in the amount of \$826,706 for the first 45 days of school.

### Districts Comparisons for FY22 COVID Expenses

An attached survey of numerous surrounding school districts reflects their intention on whether or not to budget for COVID expenditures.

#### Federal Grant Reimbursements

There are no restrictions preventing a district from budgeting for COVID; however, recent federal stimulus funds that have become available to districts are not allowed to supplant budgets. Districts who choose to budget for COVID would not be able to submit those items to federal reimbursement grants should they become available in the future. Only items outside of the budget that were unanticipated are eligible for reimbursement.

#### Minimum Budget Requirement (MBR)

Connecticut's MBR prohibits a municipality from budgeting less for education than it did the previous year. School districts that are in the top 10 percent of all school districts, according to the Connecticut State Department of Education's accountability index, are exempt from MBR requirements. Given the disruptions caused by COVID, the last published accountability index was for the school year 2018-2019 and Darien was in the top 10%. It remains to be determined how or if the state will use the 2018-2019 index for FY23. Without this provision or without legislative relief, COVID expenses would be included in the base budget for FY23.
