Important health information for the upcoming 2019-20 school year

Student Health Requirements

All physicals and immunizations must be reviewed and approved by a school nurse prior to enrollment and participation in high school interscholastic athletics.

Physical exams with up-to date immunizations <u>are required prior to enrollment, when transferring into the district,</u> <u>prior entry into Pre-K, Kindergarten, and prior to entry into 7th and 10th grade.</u> In addition all students who participate in DHS interscholastic athletics must submit a valid physical per <u>CIAC guidelines</u>. The physical exam must be on the <u>State of Connecticut Health Assessment</u> record for K-12 students or the <u>Early</u> <u>Childhood Assessment</u> for Pre-K Students/ELP (Early Learning Program) Students.

Emergency Contact Information

The school nurse uses the parent/guardian/emergency contact information collected in <u>ASPEN</u> reach you in the event of a medical emergency. It is of <u>utmost importance</u> the information provided is <u>accurate and current</u>. It is <u>essential</u> for Parents/Guardians to complete the emergency information for <u>each student</u> electronically via the ASPEN system <u>upon enrollment, annually and ongoing if contact/medical information changes.</u>

Medications

A written medication order from an authorized prescriber and parent/guardian written authorization are required, for school nurses, or in the absence of a nurse, other designated personnel to administer medication, including over-the-counter drugs. Medications must be in the original, properly labeled container and dispensed by a physician/pharmacist. Over-the-counter medications must be delivered in an unopened, properly labeled container. *ALL medications must be delivered to/from school by a parent, guardian or other responsible adult. All medication will be destroyed if not picked up within one week following termination of the order or the last day of school, whichever comes first.* The medication form can be located <u>here</u>.
