EDUCATIONAL SPECIFICATIONS FOR DARIEN PUBLIC SCHOOLS ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE

Project: Partial roof replacement, Darien Public Schools Central Office Building, 35 Leroy Avenue, Darien, CT 06820

1. RATIONALE:

The long range plan for the school district shows the Central Office building getting a partial roof replacement of the slate roof installed before 1982. The flat roof section was replaced during the renovations of 2012-13. There are numerous areas of the older slate roof that are constantly undergoing repairs. Extensive damage to the building could be caused if the roof is left un-replaced.

2. LONG RANGE PLAN:

The long range capital plan for the school facilities calls for timely replacement of all the roofs in the school district.

3. THE PROJECT:

The following are the components of the roof replacement project:

- Test and identify any asbestos containing building materials (ACBM), and any PCB's or lead.
- Remove slate shingles down to deck and properly dispose of any hazardous materials which may be present
- Install rigid insulation boards to bring the R value up to code requirements
- Install new flashing and new 30 years asphalt shingles
- Repair gutters, soffits, and masonry as needed (minor repairs anticipated).
- The Central Office Building currently houses the Superintendent's Office, Curriculum and Instruction, Finance and Operations, Special Education, IT, and Human Resources.
- The building type is masonry walls, reinforced concrete floors with a wooden roof frame and deck.
- No FF&E is involved in this project


