Curriculum at a Glance Art Drawing and Painting 1/ Grades 9-12

Description: The basics of drawing and painting will be studied. Art projects include working with color theory and harmony; life drawing; and experiments with media such as oil pastel, chalk pastel, acrylics, and watercolor. Various subject matter, composition, color theory, and craftsmanship as well as realism and abstraction will be studied. Works of historical and contemporary art are studied as they relate to ongoing projects.

Acrylic Painting	 Students will experiment with forms, structures, materials, concepts, media and art making approaches Students will engage in making a work of art without having a preconceived plan. Students will be introduced to a variety of acrylic painting methods.
Illustration	 Students will synthesize and relate knowledge and personal experiences to make art. Students will use knowledge of social, cultural, historical and personal life with art-making approaches to create meaningful works of art. Students will select references and an artistic medium and to best represent their vision.
